GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION AND INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Midshipmen were admitted from every state in the Nation, as well as the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, Northern Marianas Island and the U.S. Virgin Islands. The Class of 2020 also includes seventeen international students from: Bulgaria (1), Cameroon (1), Honduras (1), Kazakhstan (1), Korea (1), Marshall Islands (1), Mexico (2), Micronesia (1), Philippines (1), Peru (2), Poland (2), Singapore (1), and Tunisia (2).

- * 85 additional students have completed at least one semester of study at a college or university, and one at a post-secondary prep school

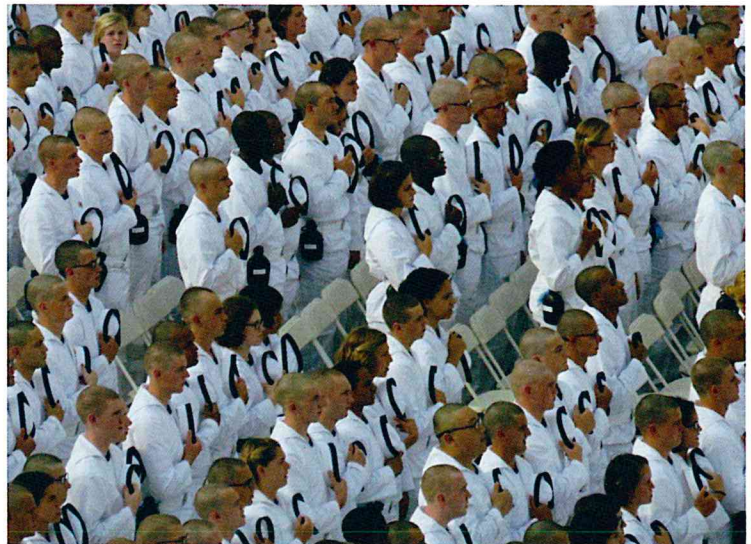
