





Takeaways 2012 graduate

Just prior to my 1/C year, I participated in a one-month faculty led program in Chile and Argentina. The program's complete immersion enhanced not only my language competency but also my critical thinking and diplomacy tactics—skills which I later employed during two deployments overseas in the Arabian Gulf, Oceania, and East Asia theatres. The ability to understand and engage with our partners and allies is vital to sustaining U.S. legitimacy and naval superiority. As a Naval Surface Warfare Officer, I was at the tip of the spear leading international engagement during community relations projects and coalition naval exercises. My experiences abroad in Chile and Argentina undoubtedly afforded the best opportunities to practice international engagement propelling my personal and professional growth as a Naval Officer.
